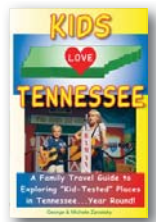


Need Some Fresh Ideas for Travel With the Kids This Year...

To research and write "Kids Love Tennessee" the authors and their kids traveled over 3000 miles in Tennessee. As a family they have traveled over 250,000 miles and visited 5000 kid-friendly places in 14 states.



In Tennessee, explore places where you can “discover” pearls, ride the rails, or meet three Kings (of Rights, Rock & Soul). Be inspired listening to the rich traditions of Country music fame.

But, planning trips can be so frustrating. Searching on the Internet takes so much time – especially if you’re planning a short trip with family or friends. **And, how can you decide which places are “kid-friendly” and a good value?**

Take a look at the picture of items we’ve collected from our travels in Tennessee. See if you can find...

- A **Pearl Shell** from the only freshwater pearl farm in the United States.
- A **Sack of Grain, Wool or Homemade Nail** from Appalachian and Pioneer folks life.
- Stand side-by-side a baker or a **Basketball** player, watch a carousel animal carved before your eyes or learn the secrets of making **Guitars** and mining **Copper**.
- A Cherokee **Alphabet** or a Sam Houston schoolhouse **Ruler**.

- View original Presidential belongings (a tailor’s scissors, a **Hermitage Puzzle**, an **Andrew Jackson doll**).
- Go behind the scenes of famous recording studios or tour popular Ice Cream factories (**hair net**).
- Want Action? Trolley, Duck boat, cruise or walk past famous landmarks. Like Water? Boardwalk through a wetland habitat (look for beaver dams), find the **Lost Sea**, or hop, skip and steamboat along the Mississippi.
- Meet famous **Bird Dogs** or catch a chilling stare from a **shark** (up-close!). Pack your knapsack as you hike to find hidden waterfalls and gorges full of meandering **Salamander** or sightings of **Black Bear**. Ride the rails (**Train**) past old bridges and countrysides near old battlefields.

Of course, there are plenty of kid-friendly details on nationally known sites like Graceland (oh! A **scarf** from Elvis), the Grand Ole Opry, Dollywood, **Davy Crockett’s Birthplace**, or places where war hurt (Sam Davis & Carter House).

If you’re hungry, **KIDS ♥ TENNESSEE** knows where to sample shortbread or beaten biscuits (kids can beat it 500 times), be an Old World bread taste-tester, or make Tennessee cheddar. The book will tell you how to eat your way through cornbread, strawberry and RC & Moon Pie festivals. Unusual theme restaurants include a train station serving yummy crackling cornbread or line-dancing at a saloon. Even eat on top of a rock.
